


Communication and Language






We love using Makaton signs and symbols throughout our school day and you will often find us singing along to our favourite songs whilst using lots of Makaton. Every Monday, we have a Makaton 'Sign of the Week' to learn and practice with our teachers and friends. During each topic, we learn new signs for our core vocabulary and encourage the children to use Makaton in their play and learning.


Sharing a story!



It is an expectation for parents and carers that you encourage a love of reading and share a story with your child at home. Once your child is settled in The Hive, we will send home 'Sharing Books' for you to read together.













Communication




ClassDojo is a wonderful platform for schools and parents to communicate with each other. The Hive staff will use ClassDojo to post photos and share videos of all the fantastic things your child gets up to at Nursery! There will be termly updates on our class page full of useful information and dates for the diary.

As a parent you will also be able to see our whole school story which has information about other events and activities taking place in the whole school. You can use ClassDojo to send messages straight to your class teacher if you ever need to contact us.

Please keep an eye out for an email invitation which will be sent to you once your child starts with us.

Tapestry is an online learning journal that The Hive uses alongside ClassDojo. It is specific to Early Years so you might see your child's teachers linking their posts and your child's photos to assessment checkpoints. As a parent you can use Tapestry at home to post your own photos, videos and comments.

We set weekly 'Tapestry Challenges' for you to complete at home with your child. These are helpful ways you can support your child with their learning and development. One week it might be drawing a brilliant picture, the next it could be taking photos of what you can find on a nature walk! In 'Show and Tell' we enjoy sharing your photos and videos from home as it gives children the opportunity to talk about themselves and their family with their friends and teachers.





Say hello to our class teddy named Buzz!

Buzz enjoys going home with different children. Your child will get a turn to take Buzz home with them, if you have a special event coming up please let us know. It is completely up to you how you spend your time with Buzz. Some families eat meals together, complete crafting activities, go on a walk or have a fun adventure out and about. We ask that you take some photos of Buzz on his visit and post them to Tapestry so we can share them as a class and your child can tell us about their time together.

REMINDERS AND NOTES

- Your child should **bring a named water bottle with them everyday**. This can be brought in on a Monday and stay in school until the end of the week when it needs to be taken home and cleaned.
- Please could you pack a spare pair of clothes in your child's bag so if they get wet or dirty they can be changed.
- It is an expectation that **children are toilet trained before starting our nursery**. We are happy to discuss this with you before your child's start date and offer you some support if needed.
- Please ensure your **child brings a coat with them everyday**, preferably a raincoat as this means we can still have lots of fun outdoors in all weathers!



- Wearing School Uniform is optional for nursery aged children. If your child does not wear school uniform please remember to send them in practical clothing so they can learn, play and explore at ease. Please note we do lots of messy activities at nursery and although we are always mindful of children's clothing they are always encouraged to get stuck in.
- Label, label—clothes, bags, and water bottles.
- No jewellery is allowed. Children with pierced ears should only wear small stud earrings please.
- We have plenty of lovely resources at Nursery so we ask that **personal items stay at home**. Any items and/or toys from home which are brought into school might get lost or broken.



Toothbrushing

As a nursery, we take part in the Brushing Buddies initiative. We encourage and support children to brush their teeth and aim to do this throughout the school week.



Tidy Up Prizes

To encourage children to tidy up after playing, we give out prizes. If your child is our tidy up super star they might come home with a little reward.





Children's Centre

We work closely with the local children's centre service which is located on Bowbridge Road in Hawtonville. If you ever need any extra support (e.g. with sleep, routines, behaviour, diet, and/or toileting) please let us know as they are such a helpful service to use.
